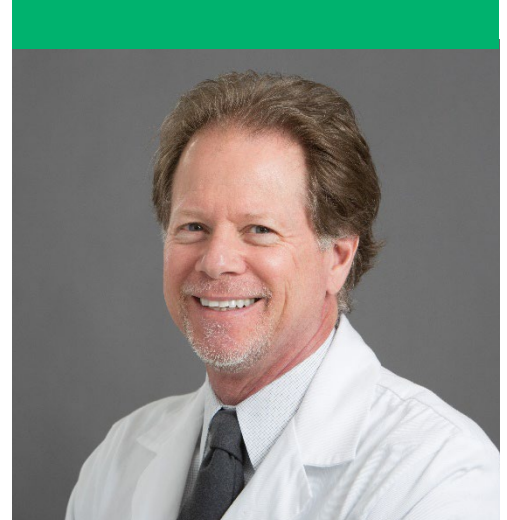

Advancement of Medicine

2023 marked the fourth year of an extremely successful preoperative telemedicine program to improve the care of patients with complex medical problems who require surgery. Patients can now be evaluated from their home, often minimizing long-distance travel, and undergo a relatively thorough examination to determine if they are medically optimized to undergo their procedure. This is a model for other specialties within the institution to augment patient care throughout the state.

I continue to take an active role in resident and departmental education by actively teaching in our clinic and organizing our weekly Grand Rounds lecture series. I also continue to serve the institution as a member of our Conflict of Interest, or COI, Committee.

As an associate dean, I ensure that all our College of Medicine's affiliation agreements meet the standards of all regulatory agencies.
