Perinatal NET (Narrative Exposure Therapy) Training Program

Objectives

As perinatal professionals we know:

- Traumatic stress symptoms (PTSD) are common during pregnancy and postpartum
- Pregnancy and birth can be triggering for survivors of trauma
- Evidence-based interventions are lacking for perinatal populations
- Revisiting trauma memories during pregnancy has been discouraged, but many survivors benefit from having someone to guide them through making sense of their experiences

Program Description
