

Advancement of Medicine

This year, I published 16 articles in prestigious, high-impact journals that help health care professionals in the U.S. and around the world manage their patients. As past governor of the Illinois Chapter of the American College of Cardiology, or ACC, I am still very involved with the statewide scholarly activities that the organization sponsors. We have statewide meetings that discuss the care of patients with cardiovascular disease so that we can all learn from each other and hear about the latest innovations in our field.

I continue caring for patients at the Rush Heart Center for Women and Rush Cardiology. As the section chief of Research and Academic Affairs at the Division of Cardiology, I organize the promotion of my cardiology colleagues.

In 2024, funds from this endowment were used to help pay for statistical analysis, publication fees, and medical students, residents and fellows presenting our research at national meetings. The fund continues to pay for a portion of my time mentoring students, residents and fellows.

Research

I continue to work with several faculty members at the College of Nursing and Rush Medical College on our National Institutes of Health grant. We have analyzed the data we collected over the last two years, reported our results at the American Heart Association's 100th Year Scientific Sessions in Chicago and published them in *Circulation* on November 11, 2024. We have also submitted the paper to the *Journal of Alzheimer's Disease*.
