Alumni Spotlight

Teppei Shimasaki is a recent graduate from the Masters in Clinical Research program. We had a chance to speak with Teppei to ask him about the program and his overall experience at Rush University. See what he has to say....

Q: What led you to pursue a MS at Rush?

After 2 years of infectious disease (ID) fellowship, I had an opportunity to extend my training 1 more year as a CDC epicenter research fellow at Rush. I decided to join the Masters in Clinical Research program when I was a second year ID fellow, mainly to prepare as a research fellow and maximize the opportunity for research.

Q: What was your thesis project about?

I studied the association between a biomarker, which is widely used as pre-transplant screening for latent tuberculosis, and post-transplantation complication. I was able to go through all the processes including IRB approval, data collection and analysis under the supervision and support of my research mentor.

Q: Any fond memories from your time at Rush?

I enjoyed and learned a lot over three years of the ID training and Clinical Research program at Rush. I was lucky to have an opportunity to work with excellent faculty members.

Q: Where are you working now? Share an overall explanation.

As a research fellow, I was able to devote my entire time for clinical research without any other duties. I am finishing my 3rd year research fellowship now and when I move back to Japan, I would like to continue to be involved in current research projects.

Q: If you are still doing research, what is your current project focusing on?

I am currently studying the association between enteric microbiota and multidrug resistant (MDR) bacterial acquisition/infection.

Q: Where do you hope to be in 5 years?

I believe good clinical questions come from patient care at the bedside. Thus, I would like to keep a good balance between the duties of a clinician researcher and educator.

Q: What advice do you have for other Rush students?

At Rush, there are numerous opportunities for learning; make sure to utilize and maximize these opportunities.
