### **CURRENT RESEARCH PROJECTS**

### Narrative production characteristics of Bengali-English bilingual patients with Alzheimer's Disease

The goal of this research is to characterize narrative productions of Bengali-English bilingual speakers with Alzheimer's Disease in Bengali (L1) and English (L2). The study also aims to identify and document cross-linguistic patterns, i.e., similarities and differences across different linguistic domains (e.g., syntax, morphology, and lexicon) in these individuals.

 Establishing gold standards for spoken discourse analysis in aphasia: A survey of current practices

The purpose of this study is to collect information from clinicians and researchers regarding the collection, analysis, and reporting of spoken discourse data in aphasia. This study is the first phase of a larger study that is aimed at addressing a major gap in aphasia literature, i.e., a lack of standardization of spoken discourse measurement in aphasia.

#### PREVIOUS RESEARCH PROJECTS

- Effects of epilepsy of language functions: Scoping review and data mining findings
  This research involved an extensive literature review of language functions in adults with epilepsy.
  With access to social network data, we utilized data mining methods to determine if individuals with epilepsy are expressing language-related concerns in their day-to-day communication.
- Language functions in adults with epilepsy: Preliminary electrophysiological and behavioral findings

The aim of this study was to address the research gaps identified in our scoping review study and systematically investigate language abilities in individuals with epilepsy using cognitive-linguistic and EEG measures.

The relationship between executive functions, spoken discourse, and psychosocial outcomes in individuals with aphasia.

My dissertation research is aimed towards exploring the relationship between cognitive skills including executive functions and spoken discourse productions of individuals with chronic aphasia. Further, the associations between such cognitive-linguistic functions and psychosocial outcomes in aphasia will also be investigated.
